## **Indian Council of World Affairs**

The Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) was established in 1943 by a group of eminent intellectuals led by Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru and Dr. H. N. Kunzru. Its principal objective was to create an Indian perspective on international relations and act as a repository of knowledge and thinking on foreign policy issues.

The Council today conducts policy research through an in-house faculty as well as through external experts. It regularly organizes an array of intellectual activities including conference, seminars, roundtable discussions, lectures and brings out a range of publications. It has a well stocked library, publishes the journal 'India Quarterly', and is active on social media.

ICWA has over 100 MoUs with leading international and national think tanks, research and academic institutions to promote better understanding on international issues and develop areas of mutual cooperation. The Council's international partnerships are focused on dialogue and joint activities like research publications, while its national outreach is focused on creating awareness of and scholarship on issues pertaining to foreign policy and international relations.



## VISION

**An Act of Parliament in 2001 declared the ICWA to be an ‘institution of national importance’ and laid down its objectives:**

**To promote the study** of Indian and international affairs so as to develop a body of informed opinion on international matters.

**To promote India’s relations** with other countries through study, research, discussions, lectures, exchange of ideas and information with other organizations within and outside India engaged in similar activities.

**To serve as a clearing house** of information and knowledge regarding world affairs.


**To publish** books, periodicals, journals, reviews, and papers and pamphlets.



## SAPRU HOUSE

The ICWA is headquartered in Sapru House, an iconic heritage building in the heart of New Delhi that was inaugurated by the first Prime Minister of India, Shri Jawaharlal Nehru in May 1955. Its red sandstone facade, Sanchi stupa like dome, Islamic arch & Hindu temple like pillars combine ancient Indian antecedents with modernist architecture. The construction of Sapru House was undertaken by the then office bearers of the ICWA and was financed through public subscription. A list of those who contributed is etched in marble at the building entrance.



ICWA undertakes several initiatives towards fulfillment of its mandated objectives to promote understanding on international affairs from an Indian perspective and to act as a repository of information and knowledge on international affairs. The activities include research, publications, intellectual activities in the form of bilateral dialogues, international conferences, seminars, lectures, panel discussions and outreach with international and national partners.

## RESEARCH

ICWA carries out policy research through its in-house faculty and through external experts. It also undertakes research in collaboration with its MoU partners and GOI entities.

Its research and publication works are in the form of short analytical papers, in- depth studies, special publications, guest papers, book projects and its flagship journal India Quarterly. These are on topical issues and on emerging trends in international relations having a bearing on Indian foreign policy and India's interests.

## ❁ CONFERENCE GRANTS

ICWA routinely organizes outreach conferences both in English and Hindi in collaboration with Universities and Research Institutions across the country. ## ❁ PARTNER INSTITUTIONS

Reaching out to like-minded institutions has been a priority of the Council since its founding. The ICWA has undertaken a conscious effort to expand its outreach by signing MoUs with think tanks, research institutes and universities at the international and national level. The Council's International MoU partners now cover wide range countries in all continents. Its national MoU partners are spread across the country. While the international MoUs enable ICWA to structure dialogue and exchange of views with international partners on topics of bilateral and topical interest, national MoUs expand the Council's ability for outreach in terms of awareness creation on foreign policy and international affairs and promotion of the study of international affairs through joint events and joint studies.

## ❁ FOREIGN POLICY AWARENESS SCHEME

The scheme aims to increase and widen awareness about foreign policy and international politics in general as well as India's foreign policy perspectives in particular among university students. The proposed activities include Essay competitions, Paper reading contests, Debates and Panel discussions, etc. Subjects for such intellectual activities are mutually worked out by the host institution and ICWA.

Under the Council's University Outreach Programme, ICWA Research Faculty visits various universities across India to give lectures to the students & the faculty, as well as conducts workshops in collaboration with the universities to create awareness about India's foreign policy interests & international affairs among young international relations scholars.


## BOOK GRANTS

In accordance with its objectives and mandate, the Council commissions original manuscripts of well-researched books on themes of international relations and foreign policy. The main objective of the ICWA Book Grant is to build and enhance research capacities and encourage the professional development of academics, specialists and emerging researchers in the field of international relations, area studies and India's foreign policy.



## ❁ BOOKS IN HINDI AND OTHER INDIAN LANGUAGES

The Council also promotes quality research and publications in Hindi by publishing original monographs on international affairs and foreign policy themes. The Council also has a robust translations programme in which its publications are translated into Hindi and other Indian languages.



## ❁ INDIA QUARTERLY

India Quarterly is the flagship publication of the Council on international affairs and has come out regularly since 1945. It is published in collaboration with SAGE Publications, New Delhi. A reputed peer – reviewed journal, it is listed on citation databases such as SCOPUS, EBSCO, Clarivate Analytics (Digitized). It is also being published in Hindi beginning 2020.



## THE LIBRARY

The ICWA Sapru House Library, established in 1943, is a premier resource hub for scholars, researchers, and policy analysts. With a rich collection of over 1.56 lakh books and 39,000 bound volumes, it offers an extensive range of knowledge across various disciplines. The library subscribes to more than 800 print and electronic journals and provides access to prominent databases like JSTOR and Megzeter. Additionally, it holds digital versions of over 500 rare books and maintains a unique archive of one million newspaper clippings in digital format. The library also boasts an exceptional collection of published works from the League of Nations, the United Nations and its agencies, and the European Union, making it a key destination for international relations and policy research.


