



Talk by H.E. Mr. Jorge Rojas Rodríguez, Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs of Colombia, 17 October 2024




H.E. Rodriguez in his talk outlined the new Colombian government's progressive foreign policy that places life at the center and focuses on climate change. He spoke of the traditional unique Colombian approach on rights of nature. He highlighted that Colombia was to host the next CoP of the Convention on Biodiversity (CBD) and looked forward to consensus-based initiatives. He stated that Colombia aims to shift away from traditional North-centric alignments, advocating for greater South South collaboration with Asia and Africa. Colombia is pushing for a diplomatic revolution that integrates ecological protection with global peace, proposing initiatives like debt relief in exchange for environmental preservation and fostering partnerships to tackle climate challenges. He stated that Colombia is looking at India as strategic partner in its endeavour to highlight the need for action on climate.

GIZ Pre-training and Workshop on "Precarious Working Conditions and Global Care Chain" under 'Shaping Development-Oriented Migration (MEG)', 21 October 2024



Under their programme, Shaping Development-Oriented Migration (MEG), GIZ India organised a full-day training workshop focused on key challenges and opportunities that migrant care workers face abroad and on formulating policies on Global Care Chains. Ambi, RA & Lead, Centre for Migration, Mobility & Diaspora Studies, ICWA addressed the need for an intersectional lens in understanding care migration and the value Pre-Departure Orientation Training (PDOT) could play in ensuring the safety and preparedness of care migrant workers abroad. The training had a diverse representation, including State recruitment agencies (Non-Resident Keralites Affairs (NORKA) Roots and Telangana Overseas Manpower Company Ltd (TOMCOM), and a prospective migrant. These representatives shared valuable field insights, shedding light on the lived realities behind care migration.

Migration experts, including Dr. Praveena Kodoth from the Centre for Development Studies (CDS), Kerala, and Dr. Divya Balan, Assistant Professor at FLAME University, Pune, contributed valuable insights.

12th Meeting of CICA Think Tank Forum (TTF), 23-25 October 2024

The 12th Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia (CICA) Think Tank Forum (TTF) was organized by the Shanghai Institutes for International Studies (SIIS) at Shanghai on 24-25 October 2024. ICWA is a representative think tank from India and participated in the Forum. The theme of the 12th CICA TTF was 'Asia's New Role in a Multipolarizing World'. The Forum had three working sessions: 1- Development of a Multipolar World from an Asian Perspective; 2 - Global Sustainable Development from an Asian Perspective; 3 - Construction of CICA Mechanism from an Asian Perspective.



Emphasizing the importance of Asia's growing influence in shaping global dynamics, the CICA TTF participants highlighted the significance of multilateralism. They suggested that international politics is moving towards multilateralism and Asian countries will play an increasingly important role in the process given the region's rapid economic growth and geopolitical significance. In the Forum, discussions focused on key topics such as regional cooperation, security and peace, connectivity, finance, climate change, and achieving sustainable development. Participants underlined that Asia is facing multiple traditional and non-traditional security challenges and regional cooperation should be enhanced by way of dialogue through the mechanism of CICA.

Participants from India highlighted that multipolar world is feasible only by a multipolar Asia. A multi-polar Asia is necessary for both the Asian Century and for a multi-polar world. It was also said that reformed multilateralism will reinforce multipolarity. CICA is transforming itself into a full-fledged international organization – a process initiated under the current Chair Kazakhstan. Azerbaijan is set to become the next Chair of CICA, the Kazakhstan side expressed hope that Baku will continue the transformation.

Workshop on 'Constitutionalism and Federalism' for delegation from Myanmar, 5-6 November 2024

The 2nd Lecture Series on "Constitutionalism and Federalism" was organised by ICWA for visiting Myanmar Delegation from 5-6 November 2024 at Sapru House. Six lectures on various issues of constitutionalism and federalism in India were delivered to the visiting delegation by Dr. V.N. Alok, Shri B.S. Baswan, IAS (Retd.), Dr. Pinaki Chakraborty, Prof. Sudarshan Ramaswamy, and Shri Vikas Anand. The speakers delivered talks on India's experience of democracy and its machinery in upholding the Constitution and promoting unity in diversity. The Myanmar Delegation was particularly curious and asked several questions regarding the Panchayati Raj System in India. They also learned about the differences in the functioning of the corresponding institutions, like the Finance Commission.

Meeting with Prof Dr. Nguyen Xuan Thang, Politburo Member of CPV, Vietnam, Sapru House, 12 November 2024



On 12 November 2024, His Excellency Prof. Dr. Nguyen Xuan Thang, Politburo Member of CPV, President of HCMA and Chairman of Central Theory Council and his team visited the Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) and met Ms Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Additional Secretary of the Council, with whom he had an enriching dialogue on various issues of India-Vietnam bilateral relation, and also on major points of engagement in the global context.

Both sides discussed the growing bilateral relationship, especially in the defence and maritime fields. India and Vietnam stand for peace in the region, as exemplified by the convergence between India's approach to strategic autonomy and Vietnam's Four No's Policy. They also proposed new areas of cooperation, including capacity building in disaster management and clean energy transition. Another focus area of the dialogue was the two countries' commonality in promoting a people-centric approach to their respective economies.

Panel Discussion on "Ukraine & Gaza Wars: Crisis of Liberal International Order", 19 November 2024



ICWA organised a Panel Discussion on "Ukraine & Gaza Wars: Crisis of Liberal International Order" at Sapru House on 19 November 2024. The session was chaired by Amb Mohan Kumar, O. P. Jindal University and the discussants were Prof Chintamani Mahapatra (retd.), Jawaharlal Nehru University, Prof Sanjay Kumar Pandey, Centre for Russian and Central Asian Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University and Dr Atul Mishra, Shiv Nadar University. In her opening remarks Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Additional Secretary, ICWA spoke briefly about the international liberal order. She highlighted eight objectives for the human-centric international order: absence of war; long-term peace, stability, and security; firm

state as an essential unit of international polity, political independence, and responsible behaviour; harmonious and friendly inter-state relations; multipolarity; humanities and state's resources dedicated to people welfare; all-round prosperity; and a just balance of rights and obligations.



Amb Mohan Kumar, furthering the discussion, placing some thought-provoking questions said that liberalism is currently in a state of a full-blown crisis. Prof Chintamani Mahapatra started with the impacts of the Ukraine and Gaza wars especially on the global supply chains. Prof Sanjay Kumar Pandey initiated his remarks by questioning how 'liberal' and 'international' the liberal international order truly was. He endorsed Joseph Nye's critical statement that liberal order was limited to like-minded states across the Atlantic littorals and did not include states such as the Soviets, China, and India. Dr Atul Mishra said that the liberal international order is in terminal decline. He differentiated between the liberal international order and the rule-based international order. Drawing attention to the post-World War days, he said the liberal international order was one of the three bounded orders that we witnessed under the umbrella of the rules-based international order. The discussion was followed by a brief question answer session.

Fourth Track 1.5 India-Germany Dialogue, 20 November 2024



The fourth Indo-German 1.5 Track Strategic Dialogue was held in Berlin, Germany on 20 November 2024. The 2+2 Policy Dialogue saw the participation of ICWA and RIS on the Indian side and GIGA and SWP Berlin on the German side. The ICWA/Indian delegation was led by Ambassador Gurjit Singh, former Ambassador of India to Germany. RIS delegation was led by Amb. Amar Sinha, former Secretary (Economic Relations), MEA India. On the German side, the delegation was led by Dr. Stefan Mair, Director, SWP Berlin and Dr. Patrick Köllner, Director, GIGA. Ambassador of India to Germany, Ajit Vinayak Gupte and Director of Indo-Pacific Policy, South Asia and Afghanistan, Federal Foreign Office, Germany, Erik Kurzweil also participated in the Dialogue. Discussions were held on the state of Indo-German relations; cooperation in the Indo-Pacific; global and trade cooperation; climate and tech cooperation between India and Germany. Both sides reaffirmed the need for enhancing bilateral ties including for strengthened India-EU relations.

Visit of Dr. Seyed Mohamad Sadegh Emamian, Co-Founder and Former Director, Governance and Policy Think Tank, Sharif University of Technology, Tehran, 20 November 2024

The Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) hosted a closed-door interaction on the topic - 'Situation in West Asia and India-Iran Bilateral Relations' on the 20 November 2024, chaired by Dr. Nivedita Ray, Director Research. The guest speaker for this event was Dr. Seyed Mohamad Sadegh Emamian, Co-Founder and Senior Advisor of the Governance and Policy Think Tank and Assistant Professor at Amirkabir University of Technology in Iran.

Focusing on the three themes, Dr. Emamian, articulated the significance of Chabahar port and corridor collaboration for Iran-India bilateral relations, as well as Iran's prospective recalibration of its security and deterrence strategies in light of the new Trump administration. He said that both nations possess a profound cultural heritage alongside a shared legacy of non-alignment and international autonomy. On 15 March 1950, India and Iran established a formal alliance through a treaty of friendship. The visit of Prime Minister Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee to Iran, culminating in the ratification of the Tehran Declaration in April 2001, laid the groundwork for President Seyyed Mohammad Khatami's visit to India and the subsequent New Delhi Declaration in 2003, thereby significantly enhancing the framework of cooperation between India and Iran. These two seminal documents elucidated the avenues for potential collaboration and formulated a visionary blueprint for the sustained partnership between the two nations.

Chair remarked that India has never acted against Iran's interests. India has backed Iran within the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) as well as in BRICS. Iran needs to show greater dedication towards addressing the sanctions issue. India maintains its commitment to the Chabahar project and emphasizes the importance of

a political resolution in Gaza crisis. In light of the rising tensions in the West Asian region, the Chair reiterated that India has always advocated for dialogue and diplomacy, urging restraint from both sides. There is a need to tap into the economic potential of India-Iran trade relations. With the new Trump administration taking office, India is hopeful for a peaceful resolution of the crisis. The talk was followed by a Question Answer session.

Panel Discussion on "China's New Global Initiatives: Agenda and Outcomes", 26 November 2024



ICWA organised a panel discussion on "China's New Global Initiatives: Agenda and Outcomes" at Sapru House on 26 November 2024. The Discussion was chaired by Amb. Nalin Surie Former Ambassador to China and Distinguished Fellow, DPG, New Delhi. Smt. Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Additional Secretary, ICWA, delivered welcome remarks. Lt. Gen. S L Narasimhan, Former DG, CCCS, New Delhi; Prof. B R. Deepak, JNU, New Delhi; and Prof. Avinash Godbole, O.P. Jindal University, Sonipat, made their remarks as Panellists.

The initiatives by China like the Global Developmental Initiative (GDI) Global Security Initiative (GSI), Global Civilisational Initiative (GCI), were announced over the last three years or so, are to be seen in continuation of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). These initiatives are to be seen as a collective with one feeding into another. It was pointed out that these initiatives are a reflection of Beijing;s desire for a sino-centric world order. At the same time, it was noted that these initiatives and proposals are to be seen as a reaction to positions that have been taken by other countries, beginning with the West as well as the Indo-Pacific vision.



The 14th Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia Pacific (CSCAP) General Conference, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, 2-3 December 2024



The 14th General Conference of CSCAP was held on 2-3 December 2024 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. CSCAP India was represented by Ambassador Prashant Pise, Deputy Director General, ICWA and Dr. Sanjeev Kumar, Senior Research Fellow & Coordinator, CSCAP-India. Prof. Prabir De, RIS, New Delhi, spoke in session IV of the Conference on behalf of CSCAP-India. Prof. Faiz Abdullah, CSCAP Co-Chair (ASEAN Chair) and Chairman, ISIS, Malaysia, delivered opening remarks. He noted that this is an opportune time for Malaysia as it assumes the Chairmanship of ASEAN in 2025. This is a significant responsibility that comes at a particularly critical juncture for Southeast Asia and the broader region.

The Keynote Address was delivered by Dato' Seri Utama Haji Mohamad bin Haji Hasan, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Malaysia. He highlighted that in addressing shared security challenges, the countries can adopt a number of collaborative strategies, such as (a) strengthening regional defence frameworks, (b) developing conflict resolution mechanisms, and (c) maritime security collaboration. The Foreign Minister noted that as Malaysia takes on the ASEAN chairmanship in 2025, it aims to make tangible progress with a commitment to inclusivity, sustainability and regional cooperation.

Indian representative highlighted that countries of Global South should be working together to address challenges in promoting supply chain resilience. The Global South is important for a number of reasons, including developing rules-based global order which may lead to economic integration and supply chain resilience.

The meetings were Chaired by Prof. Faiz Abdullah - ASEAN Chair and Chairman, ISIS, Malaysia. The SCM discussed administrative and financial matters as well as progress of ongoing Study Groups.



Discussion on the book 'Friends: India's Closest Strategic Partners' authored by Dr. Sreeram Chaulia, 05 December 2024



ICWA hosted a discussion on the Book 'FRIENDS: India's closest Strategic Partners' by Professor Sreeram Chaulia. The discussion was chaired by Amb. Ashok Sajjanhar and the welcome remarks in the event was delivered by Ms. Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, AS, ICWA. The discussant remarks were given by Professor (Retd.) Mohammed Badrul Alam, Jamia Millia Islamia and Dr. Dhananjay Tripathi, Associate Professor South Asian



University. During the discussion it was pointed out that the book emphasises on the unique and independent identity of India, irrespective of its role in multilateral institutions like BRICS, SCO etc. While India is a member of the multilateral organisations, it maintains its strategic autonomy through active pursuits of interests rather than hedging. It was stated by the author that this is an optimistic book in a pessimistic time and he pointed that the book points that some friends are more complicated than others but even they are friends.

Interaction with Institute of Defence Studies, MoD, Vietnam, 11 December 2024



Ms Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Additional Secretary of ICWA, welcomed Lt. Gen Vu Cuong Quyet, Director General, Institute of Defence Studies, Ministry of Defence, Vietnam and his team on their visit to the Indian Council of World Affairs, Sapru House, New Delhi, on 11 December 2024.

They talked about the multiple challenges facing the international order. The India-Vietnam relationship becomes critical for two factors: (a) both countries face security and sovereignty challenges such as cross-border terrorism, an aggressive China and its illegal claims both in the Himalayas and in the South China Sea, and (b) convergence between India's strategic autonomy and Vietnam's 'Four No's policy. India's contribution to maritime security is critical for the region's peace and stability. India's Indo-Pacific policy is centred on the principle of ASEAN centrality.

Visit of Hon'ble Vice President of India and President, ICWA Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar to Sapru House, 14 December 2024

Hon'ble Vice-President of India and President, ICWA Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar was the Chief Guest. Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Hon'ble Minister of Communications & Development of North Eastern Region was also present on the occasion.

Panel discussion on "Recent Developments in Sri Lanka: Significance and Implications", 17 December 2024



Panel discussion on Recent Developments in Sri Lanka: Significance and Implications was held at Sapru House on 17 December 2024. Welcome remarks were given by Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Additional Secretary, ICWA. The panel discussion was chaired by Ambassador Mohan Kumar, Dean, Strategic & International Initiatives, Jindal School of International Affairs, O.P. Jindal Global University. The three eminent panellists were Prof. S.D. Muni, Professor Emeritus, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University. Prof. Ajay Darshan Behera, Academy of International

Studies, Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) and Dr. Nishan de Mel, Executive Director, Verité Research, Sri Lanka, joined the discussion virtually from Colombo.

Ms. Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Additional Secretary of the Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA), emphasised the importance of Anura Kumara Disanayaka's recent visit to New Delhi as Sri Lanka's new President. She also highlighted the millennia-old civilisational and shared cultural and historical ties between India and Sri Lanka. The panel, highlighted the election of a new president in Sri Lanka amidst the economic crisis as a triumph for democracy in South Asia and emphasized that developments in Sri Lanka recovery illustrated democracy's potential to solve domestic crises. The panel also noted that although the President, holds a two-thirds majority in parliament, the challenge lies in how he can reduce presidential powers while maintaining enough authority to combat entrenched corruption. The panel, highlighted a significant change in Sri Lanka's electoral history, where a third party, the National People's Power (NPP), disrupted the long-standing dominance of the Sri Lanka Freedom Party (SLFP) and United National Party (UNP). This event was termed a "democratic revolution," marking a historic shift in the political landscape.



Panel Discussion on "Afghanistan under the Taliban: Past Lessons and Future Paths", 20 December 2024



The Indian Council of World Affairs held a Panel Discussion on 'Afghanistan under the Taliban: Past Lessons and Future Path" on 20th December 2024. The discussion was chaired by Amb. Gautam Mukhopadhaya, former Indian envoy to Syria, Afghanistan and Myanmar. Brigadier Saurabh Sharma, Defence Advisor and Military Attache to the Indian Mission in Afghanistan (2020-21), delivered the Special Talk on Afghanistan. Raghav Sharma, Associate Professor, Jindal School of International Affairs and Director, Centre for Afghanistan Studies, Jindal Global University, and Dr. Shalini Chawla, Distinguished Fellow at the Centre for Air Power Studies, New Delhi participated as discussants. Ms. Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Additional Secretary, ICWA delivered the welcome remarks.

During the discussions it was stated that though the Taliban has consolidated its position and with this the internal security situation has improved in Afghanistan, at the same time, the humanitarian situation has worsened. The Taliban has monopolised power in Afghanistan and has moved from an insurgent group to a functional government. Although the ISKP does not immediately pose a threat to Taliban rule, it remains a common cause of concern for all the actors engaging with Afghanistan. Other challenges for the Taliban include local resistance from narco-cultivators, stagnant economy, decline in revenue collection and taxable income and lack of major investments. The Taliban-Pakistan relations remain stressed. While Pakistan is using China to mediate with the Taliban to control the TTP, Beijing has kept its ties with the Taliban independent from Pakistan. The Taliban at the same time is leveraging on China's security and economic interests. Russia, Turkey and Iran continue to play a significant role in Afghanistan.

Editorial

The year 2024 has been a year of transitions. Fifty-four per cent of the world's population, with 60% of the global GDP, have been or will go to the polls. The new leadership elected or appointed will shape an increasingly complex world environment. While most national elections are rarely fought on war and peace in distant parts, domestic concerns about the dignity of livelihood and work, economic stability, the impact of new technologies on individual lives and climate justice and sustainability are no longer just national issues but divide states along existential lines. Where the competition for resources in the neighbourhood creates a conflict over fair and just distribution, the effect of disruptive events elsewhere-recent wars which have led to rising prices of essential commodities from energy to food-also threatens to upend the best intentions of policymakers, holding domestic policies hostage to external decisions. In this intricate maze of domestic and foreign policies, national and institutional leaders face variable demands. Across the world, citizens are asking if the leaders they choose, and the institutions they create, are up to the task.

The drivers of the most significant transitions today hasten the fractures of the existing world order. As major powers focus their resources on retaining global leadership positions, we see the world order they seek to preserve disintegrating with middle powers claiming moral leadership and defining values and principles. Smaller powers are also beginning to shape their neighbourhoods through war, resource collaboration or new security policies. Popular challenges to state capture by political elites have emerged from Myanmar to South America, as has opposition to unregulated market capitalism and economic exclusion even in developed economies. Elsewhere, citizens have placed pressure on political representatives and governments to prevent the technologies of the future from being appropriated by powerful interests and raised significant questions about their ability to control the future of individuals and communities.

The transformations of the future likewise hinge on many factors, the constant being that no one state



can deal with global existential crises alone, raising questions about transnational dialogue and cooperation and, most importantly, about the capacity of global institutions to speak for everyone. Many of these issues are on the agenda at the United Nations Summit of the Future 2024, which will have been held in September this year. The agenda documents for the summit rest hope on strengthened multilateralism, global cooperation and international law, all things at risk today.

Some of the articles in this issue of the India Quarterly point to the difficulties in upholding just such institutions and conventions, and the ability of national policies to secure states and populations. In part, they speak to the difficulty with applying international law to policy, especially where longstanding conflicts persist across borders. Or in applying humanitarian perspectives to cross-border migrations when violence between communities threatens stability. Or on the longstanding impact of conflict on border populations and on interstate borders as global institutions pay lip service to peace. But they also point, in some instances, to the possibility of shifting focus from notions of the securitisation of borders and populations to looking at how security interdependence may be achieved. Finally, two papers remind us that despite hopes placed on dialogue and cooperation, power transitions remain power transitions and, as new powers seek dominance, threat perceptions are only deepened.


