Round Table Discussion on “11th Parliamentary Elections in Bangladesh”, Sapru House, 15 January, 2019

Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA), New Delhi organised a Roundtable discussion on 11th Parliamentary Elections in Bangladesh. The session was chaired by Amb. Pinak Ranjan Chakravarty, former Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh and there were four panelists namely Dr Sanjay Bhardwaj, Professor and Chairperson, Centre for South Asian Studies, JNU, Dr Smruti Pattanaik, Research Fellow, Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses, Mr. Jayant Roy Chowdhury, Sr. Editor, The Telegraph, and Dr Ashish Shukla, Research Fellow, ICWA. Amb. Dr TCA Raghavan, DG ICWA, delivered the welcome remarks. Prof. Sanjay Bhardwaj was of the view that Sheikh Hasina's victory was good for the future of India-Bangladesh Relations. Dr Smruti Pattanaik underlined various shortcomings of the electoral process and raised questions about the fairness of the election itself.

Interaction with Vietnamese Study Group at ICWA, at Sapru House, 16 January, 2019

He systematically analysed his argument by using economic models. The talk was followed by an interaction with the Research Fellows.





ICWA - Institute for Foreign Affairs and Trade (IFAT), Hungary Dialogue, Sapru House, 21-22 January, 2019

The first Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA)-Institute for Foreign Affairs and Trade (IFAT) Dialogue on “India-Hungary Relations” was organised on 21-22 January 2019 at the Sapru House, New Delhi. Both the institutions are MoU partners. The IFAT sent a delegation for dialogue on mutually agreed issues of global and bilateral importance between India and Hungary. The discussion focused on the major global, regional and bilateral political and strategic developments, and India-Hungary relations. While taking history into account, main aspects of bilateral relations between India and Hungary were analysed. Policy makers, researchers, academics and former diplomats from both sides participated in the dialogue.



Interaction with Chinese delegation from Tsinghua University, China at Sapru House, 23 January, 2019

Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) hosted an Interaction with 6-member Chinese delegation led by Prof. Wang Xiqin, Vice President, Tsinghua University on 23 January 2019 at Sapru House. Other member of Chinese delegation were: Prof. Wang Youqiang, Director, Tsinghua University Library, Dr. Zhang Chuanjie, Associate Dean, Office of International Cooperation and Exchange, Tsinghua University, Ms. Wang Yaqian, Administrator of Policy and Programs, Asian Universities Alliance Secretariat, Tsinghua University, Mr. Lei Dingkun and Mr Xie Chao working with O P Jindal University, Sonipat, India.

Ms. Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, Joint Secretary, extended a warm welcome to the visiting delegation and chaired the interaction. She gave an introduction of ICWA's past and present activities. Brief Remarks on India-China think-tanks cooperation and India-China relations were made by Dr. Sanjeev Kumar and Dr Puyam R. Singh, Research Fellows of ICWA. Prof. Wang Youqiang and other members of the delegation talked history and current activities of Tsinghua University including activities of Tsinghua University Library. Both sides favoured strengthening India-China bilateral relations and maintained that the interaction provided opportunity to know each other's institution better.





First IBSA Gandhi-Mandela Memorial Freedom Lecture by H.E. Mr. Matamela Cyril Ramaphosa, President of the Republic of South Africa, 25 January, 2019.

Indian Council of World Affairs organised the first IBSA Gandhi-Mandela Memorial Freedom Lecture on January 25, 2019 at the Grand Ball Room, Leela Palace Hotel. It celebrated 150 years of Mahatma Gandhi's birth and Nelson Mandela's birth centenary. The lecture was delivered by H.E. Mr. Matamela Cyril Ramaphosa, the President of the Republic of South Africa in the presence of Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi. Welcome remarks were delivered by Dr. T.C.A. Raghavan, Director General, Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA). The vote of thanks was given by H.E. Mr. Andre A. Correa do Lago, the Ambassador of the Federative Republic of Brazil to India.



H.E. President Ramaphosa, in his speech, said that the close relationship between India and South Africa since 1994 further deepened with South Africa joining the BRICS group in 2010. He described Afro-Asian solidarity as the root of ideas reflected in the Red Fort Declaration that President Nelson Mandela signed while visiting India in 1997. Referring to Mandela's letter from prison in 1980, President Ramaphosa acknowledged and thanked the people of India for their encouragement, inspiration and practical assistance to the South African struggle for freedom.



He also referred to Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru's sensitivity towards Africa while recalling Panditji's statement that 'the tragedy of Africa is greater than that of any other continent'. While quoting Nehru, President Ramaphosa described Asia and Africa as 'sister continents' bound by umbilical link of history. He notably dwelt upon the role of Indian diaspora in South Africa, likening their erstwhile indentured status to slavery and apartheid. President Ramaphosa acknowledged the rich contribution of vibrant culture, traditions and values of the South African Indian community to South Africa's multicultural society.



President Ramaphosa paid his tribute to Mahatma Gandhiji and Madiba (Nelson Mandela), two of the greatest leaders of their generation. President Ramaphosa also highlighted the Ten Guiding Principles announced during Prime Minister Modi's visit to Uganda, stressing on equal developmental partnership to the benefit of all. He said that South Africa looks forward to deepening relations with India through stronger commercial and people-to-people ties. The two countries also need to focus on growing trade and increasing investment in each other's economies. He said that India and South Africa would continue to work together on range of platforms like BRICS, IBSA, IORA, NAM, G20 and G77 plus China, in pursuit of a world free from poverty. The lecture was attended by an audience of about 300 including members of the diplomatic corps, think-tanks, academicians, students, media and government officials.

Second ICWA-NCWA Dialogue, Sapru House, 5 February, 2019

The Second ICWA-NCWA Dialogue on "India-Nepal Relations: Political, Economic and Cultural Cooperation" was held at Sapru House on 5th February 2019. Amb. Dr. TCA Raghavan, DG, ICWA highlighted the general trend towards strengthening of political institutions through electoral process in South Asia including in Nepal following a cycle of political instability which ended with the 2017 general elections. The Vice-President of Nepal Council of World Affairs (NCWA), Mr. Umesh Bahadur Malla, underscored the fact that Nepal's foreign policy should respond to domestic needs and priorities while taking into account other countries' interests.





In addition to the issues relating to trade deficit with India, economic and trade diversification, agriculture, tourism, development of export-oriented production, power generation and transport connectivity, he also proposed to upgrade the bilateral relationship into strategic partnership.

Prof. S.D. Muni emphasised the need for change in India-Nepal relationship as both India and Nepal have changed over the years. He also added that the India-Nepal region has changed due to shift of global centre of gravity to Asia with India as one of the fast growing economies in the world while an aspiring Nepal is looking for playing its role in the Indo-Pacific region. Prof. Mahendra P. Lama argued that incremental approach can be brought in anytime and anywhere while transformational matrices require a huge shift in the thinking process. For construction of transformational projects like highway, railway and inland waterway, he observes that it requires scientific, well-thought out policy of all four economic instruments namely, trade, aid, foreign economic assistance and investment. The discussion also covers the status of the Eminent Persons' Group (EPG) joint report to be submitted to the Prime Ministers of India and Nepal and potential areas of cooperation among the neighbouring South Asian countries under the framework of the BBIN in sectors such as transport and energy connectivity.



Book discussion on “LEGITIMACY OF POWER: The Permanence of Five in the Security Council”; [An ICWA publication, authored by Ambassador Dilip Sinha], Sapru House, 7 February, 2019.

A book discussion on “Legitimacy of Power: The Permanence of Five in the Security Council” by Ambassador Dilip Sinha [An ICWA publication] was organised at Sapru House on 7 February 2019. The event began with the welcome remarks delivered by Dr. T.C.A. Raghavan, Director General, Indian Council of World Affairs. This was followed by a brief introduction of the book, “Legitimacy of Power: The Permanence of Five in the Security Council”, an ICWA publication by author Amb. Dilip Sinha. This was followed by a panel discussion and the panellists for the session were: Amb. Kamalesh Sharma, Former Secretary General of the Commonwealth of Nations and Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations; Prof. S.D. Muni, Professor Emeritus, Jawaharlal Nehru University; Prof. C. Raja Mohan, Director, Institute of South Asian Studies, National University of Singapore; and Amb. Dilip Sinha, author of the book. The discussion was moderated by Ms. Jyoti Malhotra, Editor, National and Strategic Affairs, The Print.



Book discussion on “How India Manages its National Security” [Authored by Mr. Arvind Gupta], Sapru House, 25 February 2019.

ICWA hosted a Book Discussion on “How India Manages its National Security” by Dr. Arvind Gupta, Director, Vivekananda International Foundation (VIF) and former Deputy National Security Adviser at Sapru House on 25 February 2019. In his opening remarks, Shri N.N. Vohra, President, Indian International Centre & former Governor, Jammu and Kashmir highlighted that national security





embraces every aspect of security and recommended a holistic view of national security in actual and practical terms.

Dr. Arvind Gupta, Director, VIF opined that there is a disconnect between national security and various academic disciplines in India. He emphasised the need for greater synergy between national security and various academic disciplines. He noted that Pulwama is a result of intensification of the proxy war in Jammu and Kashmir. Lt. General (Retd.) S.L. Narasimhan argued that investment in Research & Development should be driven by the government. He cited China as a good example in this regard. Shri Nitin A. Gokhale stressed that need to discuss national security with universities and think tanks -in tier II, III cities across India. Further he highlighted the need to translate the book by Dr Arvind Gupta in various Indian languages.



Meeting with the visiting Indonesian Delegation, Sapru House, 1 March, 2019

ICWA held an interaction with a visiting Indonesian delegation led by Ms Ernawati, Deputy Director of South and Central Asia Division, Policy Planning and Research Agency, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia. The interaction was chaired by Ms. Nutan Kapoor Mahawar, JS, ICWA, at the Conference Room, Sapru House, New Delhi. The Indonesian Delegation consisted of Ms Ernawati, Deputy Director of South and Central Asia Division, Policy Planning and Research Agency, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia, Ms. Ida Humaida, Assistant Deputy Director and Mr Novrizal, Minister Counsellor, Embassy of Indonesia, New Delhi. ICWA was represented by Dr Stuti Banerjee, RF, ICWA, Dr Pragya Pandey, RF, ICWA and Dr Temjenmeren Ao, RF, ICWA.

Lecture by H. E. Ambassador Monica K. Juma, DPhil, CBS, Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Republic of Kenya, Sapru House, 5 March, 2019

The Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) organised a talk by Dr. Monica Juma, D.Phil., Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Republic of Kenya on March 5, 2019. She was on a two day official visit to India. Dr. Juma spoke on “How Africa-India Relations Fit in a Shifting World Order”. Dr. TCA Raghavan, Director General, ICWA, welcomed the distinguished speaker at the Council and the event was chaired by Amb. Rajiv K. Bhatia, Former High Commissioner of India in Kenya. She also highlighted that Continental Free Trade Area (CFTA) in Africa may be a sphere of India-Africa cooperation to digitally manage the Area. Underlining many other sectors of India-Africa cooperation, Dr. Juma said that the fundamental idea behind the cooperation is to reduce risk and vulnerability for growth.



Lecture by H. E. Dr. Mamadou Tangara, Minister for Foreign Affairs, International Cooperation, and Gambians Abroad of the Republic of The Gambia Sapru House, 7 March, 2019

Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) organised a lecture by the H.E. Dr. Mamadou Tangara, Minister for Foreign Affairs, International Cooperation, and Gambians Abroad of the Republic of The Gambia on the topic “Multilateralism and its Role in Building and Sustaining Peace in Africa and Asia” at the Sapru House on 7 March 2019. The welcome remark was delivered by Amb. Dr. TCA Raghavan, DG ICWA. The lecture was chaired by Ambassador H.H.S Viswanathan, Distinguished Fellow, Observer Research Foundation (ORF).



Dr. Mamadou Tangara focused his talk on multilateralism in context of conflicts in Africa. He commenced his talk by appreciating the efforts of United Nations (UN) in conflict prevention through preventive action rather than investing in costly peace building operations.

The Minister highlighted a renewed apatite among UN member states to move towards preventive action, realising economic considerations in peace building and peace keeping operations.



With regard to Africa, Dr. Mamadou Tangara spoke about UN cooperation with regional and sub-regional arrangement such as African Union, ECOWAS, SADC in preventing different conflict situations. He underscored that the country with the support of UN, regional bodies and neighbouring countries such as Senegal, Chad and Equatorial Guinea avoided a major conflict during Gambian election in 2017. The sheer vision and hard work of Gambian people restored democratic values after twenty two years of dictatorial rule.

With regard to India Africa relations, the Foreign Minister added that there is a sizable presence of Indian Diaspora in Gambia. He appreciated the positive contribution of Indians in Gambia to the Gambian economy and society. He observed that Indians were well integrated.

First ICWA- Institute for Political and International Studies (IPIS) Dialogue, Tehran, 12-13 March, 2019

The inaugural dialogue between Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) and Institute for Political and International Studies (IPIS) was held at Tehran on March 12-13, 2019. The dialogue saw exchange of views on world politics and global trends, South and Central Asia Developments and India-Iran bilateral relations.

The ICWA delegation was led by Amb Dr. T.C.A. Raghavan, DG, ICWA and included Amb. Gautam Mukhopadhyay, Dr. Mahtab Alam Rizvi, Associate Professor, Nelson Mandela Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution, Jamia Milia Islamia University, New Delhi, Shri Nandan Unnikrishnan, Distinguished Fellow, Observer Research Foundation and Dr. Deepika Saraswat, Research Fellow, ICWA. They were joined by Amb. Gaddam Dharmendra, Indian Ambassador to Iran, Shri Devesh Uttam, DCM, Indian Embassy, Tehran and other members from the Indian Embassy.

The IPIS delegation led by Dr. Seyed Kazem Sajjadpour, President IPIS, and included Amb. Mir Mohammad Mousavi, former ambassador to India, Alireza Bikdeli, Senior Fellow, IPIS, Mohammad Sheibani, Senior Fellow, IPIS, Dr. Mandana Tisheyar, Assistant Professor at Allameh Tabataba'i University and Mjaidreza Momeni, Associate Professor, Allameh Tabataba'i University, Tehran and numerous other members of IPIS.

Dr. T.C.A. Raghavan spoke in the session on world politics and global trends. Noting various historical milestones between the year 1919 and 2019 which had lasting influence on India's relations with the world, Dr. Raghavan spoke about 1919 as the year of four major revolutions in the then colonized world. The Amritsar massacre gave intensity to the anti-colonial struggle and the May Movement in China, Korea and Egypt were important in terms of how the relations between the East and West started to change. This year also marks the century of India's engagement in multilateralism and democratization of the system, when India joined the League of Nations in 1919.

Dr. Seyed Kazem Sajjadpour, President IPIS gave a conceptual account of how one can see the global politics in terms of ascendance and descendance, American dilemma and Asian dilemma. On the impact of changing situation on India-Iran relations, he argued that understanding the world as it is, is of strategic importance. Objective analysis is a strategic commodity. While the policy should be normative, analysis should be objective. India, he argued is a special case of both regional and global player.

Indian Ambassador to Iran Gaddam Dharmendra observed that the dynamic relation between the two countries underlined by the number of exchange of visits and how the relations are expanding including at the think tank level. He noted the importance of institutional engagement for better appreciation of each other's positions beyond the Western narrative and need for expanding the relations at track 2 and track 1.5 levels.

One day Seminar on “Recent Developments in Pakistan Occupied Jammu & Kashmir”, at Sapru House, 19 March 2019

The Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) organised a one-day seminar on Recent Developments in POJK on March 19, 2019. There were two sessions and a keynote address on Gilgit in 1947-48 by Shri Raghvendra Singh, Secretary, Ministry of Textiles, Government of India.

The seminar started with Amb. Dr. TCA Raghavan, DG ICWA, welcome remarks during which he set the tone of the seminar.

The first technical session was chaired by Amb. S.K. Lambah, former Indian High Commissioner to Pakistan. There were three panellists, Dr Ashok Behuria, Mr. Senge H. Sering, and Dr Ashish Shukla.

The second session was chaired by Amb. G. Parthasarathi, former Indian High Commissioner to Pakistan. There were three panellists, Prof. K. Warikoo, Mr. Daalat Ali, and Dr Dhrubajyoti Bhattacharjee.

The keynote address was delivered by Shri Raghvendra Singh who, based on various classified and de-classified sources, made an attempt to assess the ground situation in Gilgit during 1947-48. Shri Singh successfully established the fact that Gilgit-Baltistan was legally part of the princely state of Jammu & Kashmir and with the termination of the lease with the British in July 1947 the territory rightfully belonged to the Maharja of Jammu & Kashmir.





7th India-Saudi Arabia Workshop, ICWA- PSAIDS, Saudi Arab Dialogue, Riyadh, 26-27 March, 2019

The 7th India-Saudi Dialogue was held under the purview of Cooperation of Programme signed by Indian Council of World Affairs and Prince Al Faisal Institute of Diplomatic Studies (PSAIDS) on the eve of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Saudi Arabia On 03 April 2016. The Four Rounds of earlier Track II Dialogues between the two sides were held prior to signing of the MoU at Riyadh on 3 April 2016. The Dialogue aimed to promote and support activities that contribute to better understanding and relations between India and Saudi Arabia.



The Seventh India-Saudi Arabia Workshop was hosted by PSAIDS at Riyadh on 26 March 2019. The themes of the Dialogue largely focused on the fast changing India-Saudi engagement from transactional to strategic, new possibilities in energy cooperation, investment ties as a driver for emerging cooperation, exploring new realms in security and defence cooperation, opportunities for India through Saudi Vision 2030, economic cooperation in oil, trade, the future of Saudi-India relations and assessment of challenges to core national interests in regional geopolitics including in the Gulf region and South Asia.



The speakers representing the two reputed Think Tanks spoke on India-Saudi relations that have demonstrated an increased enthusiasm and willingness to cooperate and strengthen the bilateral relations with a new vision and approach. Saudi Arabia has long been an important Indian trade partner and remains a vital source of energy for India. Enhanced security cooperation has added a new dimension in the bilateral ties between New Delhi and Riyadh. Today, both the countries are committed to reinforce mutual interests that include security issues, counterterrorism, and engage them economically and strategically.



International Conference on ‘Afghanistan’, Sapru House, 29 March, 2019

India Council of World Affairs (ICWA) organised an international Round Table on ‘India-Afghanistan Relations: The Road Ahead’ on 29 March 2019. The Round Table was held at Sapru House and Hotel Leela Palace, New Delhi. The programme was under Chatham House rules. It consisted of two segments, one segment with two academic sessions was held at Sapru House and the second segment consisting of a keynote address during a sit-in Dinner was organised at Hotel Leela Palace.

The Round Table was organised to understand various standpoints in Afghanistan towards the ongoing multiple peace processes and intra-Afghan reconciliation talks. Afghanistan participants represented different regions, ethnicities and political outlooks.



IAFS-III: Third ICWA India-Africa Annual Academic Conference, Venue: Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, 29-30 March, 2019

The Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) organised the Third India-Africa Conference under India-Africa Forum Summit III in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia on 29-30 March 2019. The theme of the Conference was “India’s Engagement with North Africa and Horn of Africa: Issues, Initiatives and Prospects”. The ICWA, dignitaries and all other participants also took this opportunity to pay homage to the deceased in the Ethiopian Airlines crash in March 2019, by keeping a minute of silence before the beginning of the Conference. The Conference saw a high level participation from Africa. H.E. Amb. Markos Tekle (PhD), State Minister of Foreign Affairs, Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia addressed the inaugural session; and H.E. Mr. Teka Gebreyesus,





State Minister of Trade and Industry, Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia delivered the valedictory address at the closing of the Conference.

Delegates from ten countries of North Africa and Horn of Africa (Chad, Djibouti, Egypt, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Libya, Morocco, Somalia, Sudan and South Sudan) and experts, scholars and officials from Ethiopia and African Union (AU) participated during the two day deliberations and discussions. The Conference had four technical sessions covering issues related to global political dialogue and diplomacy; security and strategy; trade, economic and development partnership; and people to people relations between India and North & Horn of Africa.

Outreach Programmes of ICWA

Two Day National Conference, organized by M S Ramaiah Institute of Technology, M S Ramaiah Nagar, MSRIT Post, Bangalore, Karnataka, 4-5 January, 2019

On 4-5 January 2019, ICWA and Ramaiah Institute of Technology, Bangalore jointly conducted a two day national conference in Bangalore at the Department of Management Studies, Ramaiah Institute of Technology, Bangalore, on “New directions in Foreign Policy: People, Politics, Places and Economic Power”. The Conference deliberated on Indian foreign policy lessons from the past and issues for coming years, diaspora and foreign policy, economic relations and the influence of dominant cultural values on India’s foreign policy.
