Distinguished Members of the Afghan delegation,

Excellencies , Members of the Governing Council, Esteemed Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen

It is a great privilege for us at ICWA to extend a warm welcome to your Excellency.

2. We meet in the backdrop of a terrible tragedy caused by the massive earthquake in Nepal. On behalf of all present here, we would like to express our support and solidarity with the people of Nepal. May I read an extract from the Media Statement made by Prime Minister Sri Narendra Modi earlier today?

“President Ghani and I speak for our two countries, South Asia and the world to the people of Nepal: Your courage and humanity has earned the respect of the world. And, you are not alone at this moment of tragedy and trial. We will do everything possible with rescue and relief. And, we will certainly be there when you rebuild your lives and reconstruct your homes and heritage.”

3. The ICWA is deeply honoured by your Excellency's acceptance of our invitation to deliver the Sixteenth Sapru House Lecture. This lecture series, started in August 2012, is dedicated to the founders and builders of ICWA which has aptly been described by the Parliament of India as “an institution of national importance.” Your presence amidst us today imparts special value to the lecture series and indeed to the institution itself.

We view Afghanistan as a valuable bridge between South Asia, and Central Asia and beyond.

8. Dear friends, while many of you are familiar with the achievements of our Chief Guest, may I quickly capture a few essential facts about his illustrious background. He is a leading scholar of political science and anthropology. He studied in Afghanistan, then at the

American University of Beirut, and later at New York's Columbia University. He joined the World Bank as a lead anthropologist, advising it on the human dimension of economic programmes. He served as Afghanistan's Finance Minister for the duration of the Transitional Administration. In this capacity, he played a key role in the design and implementation of some of the most extensive and challenging reforms. Subsequently, he served as the Chancellor of Kabul University and later he was the Chairman of the Transition Coordination Commission. He was sworn in as the President of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan on 29 September 2014.
